### ANNOUNCEMENTS

ANNUAL MEETING — Members having papers to present at the Fourth Annual Meeting in the Spring of 1952 should make requests to the Chairman of the Program Committee, Professor Franz Michael, The Far Eastern and Russian Institute, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington. Definite topics or titles of papers should accompany all requests. The committee has complete freedom to select and solicit papers that will best contribute to program plans.

NOMINATIONS — The attention of members is called to Bylaw 10, which makes it possible for fifteen members to nominate candidates for elective officers if they wish to do so. The pertinent section reads as follows: "It shall also be obligatory upon the [Nominating] Committee to include among the nominees for any office the names of persons nominated by petitions signed by fifteen members in good standing and deposited with the Committee or the Secretary . . . at least 90 days prior to the Membership Meeting. The Committee may, if it desires, distinguish between its nominees and those nominated by petition." The terminal date for such nominations would be December 27, 1951, and such petitions should be sent to the chairman of the Nominating Committee, Dr. Virginia Thompson Adloff, 30 Sutton Place, New York 22, New York.
