### Transfer of British Antarctic Survey Faraday Research Station to Ukraine

A formal agreement on the transfer of Faraday Research Station to Ukraine took place at a ceremony in London on 20 July 1995. Training of Ukrainian staff at the British Antarctic Survey (BAS) HQ in Cambridge and at Faraday will precede a short period of joint operation of the station. BAS will leave in February 1996. Long-term geophysical and meteorological data will continue to be supplied to BAS researchers as a key part of the transfer agreement. The Ukraine will operate the station in accordance with the 1991 Environmental Protocol to the Antarctic Treaty.

### Plans for new Antarctic Research Station for India

### Antarctic ozone 'hole' still deepening

Ten years after the discovery of the Antarctic ozone 'hole' researchers have found the depletion to be continuing. Springtime values have fallen to less than 40% of those seen in the 1960's. Scientists hope that, as the Montreal Protocol control measures to limit production of ozone destroying chemicals come into effect, improvements will be seen by the middle of the next century.

### UN International Ozone day

The United Nations General Assembly has designated 16 September as the International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer. The day aims to raise awareness of the importance of the Montreal Protocol on Substances that deplete the Ozone Layer. The UN urges all member states to devote the day each year to promote, at national level, the objectives and goals of the Protocol.
