**Structures of the Christian Institution**

*Henry Duméry*

An English translation of Professor Duméry's exploration of the principal structures of the Christian religion and their genesis. After establishing key definitions, the author proceeds to his philosophic description of the structure of the "Jewish institution," treating such matters as historical revelation and biblical typology. He next deals with Messianism, certain aspects of Christology, and the place of doctrine and worship in the institutional structure. In the final chapter he investigates the relations between myth and history and between existence and transcendence, and examines Christian mysticism. A 26-page appendix gives a capsule history of the philosophy of religion from the pre-Socratics to the present. This lucid and concise phenomenology of the Christian institution should appeal to a broad audience, including those for whom Christianity has become a strange, puzzling, and usually misinterpreted phenomenon.
