- Leon Botstein is the President of Bard College and the Leon Levy Professor of the Arts and Humanities. He is the director of the American Symphony Orchestra and the American-Russian Youth Orchestra and the editor of *The Musical Quarterly*. He has edited the *Compleat Brahms* (1999).
- Scott Burnham is Associate Professor of Music at Princeton University. He is the author of *Beethoven Hero* (1995) and translator of *Musical Form in the Age of Beethoven* (1997), a selection of music theoretical writings by A. B. Marx. Currently he is pondering issues of subjectivity in the instrumental music of Mozart and Schubert.
- Barry Cooper is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Manchester. His books include *Beethoven and the Creative Process* (1990) and *Beethoven's Folksong Settings* (1994), and he is General Editor of *The Beethoven Compendium* (1991), a standard reference work that has been translated into five other languages. He has also written over thirty articles on Beethoven and other subjects, and completed a version of the first movement of Beethoven's unfinished Tenth Symphony.
- John Daverio is Professor of Music and Chairman of the Musicology Department at Boston University. He is the author of *Nineteenth-Century Music and the German Romantic Ideology* (1993), *Robert Schumann: Herald of a "New Poetic Age*" (1997), and numerous articles on the music of Schumann, Brahms, and Wagner.
- David B. Dennis is Associate Professor of History at Loyola University, Chicago. He is the author of *Beethoven and German Politics, 1870–1989* (1996).
- Alain Frogley is Associate Professor at the University of Connecticut, Storrs. He is the editor of *Vaughan Williams Studies* (1996). He has published articles on Beethoven in the *Musical Times* and *Beethoven Forum*, and has also written extensively on twentieth-century British music. He is a frequent contributor to *BBC Music Magazine*.
- Amanda Glauert is a Senior Lecturer at the Royal Academy of Music in London, and has contributed articles to *19th-Century Music*, the *New Grove Dictionary of Opera*, and *Wagner in Performance*. She is the author of *Hugo Wolf and the Wagnerian Inheritance* (1999).

- William Kinderman is Professor of Music at the University of Victoria, British Columbia, and has taught extensively at the Hochschule der Künste, Berlin. He is the author of *Beethoven's Diabelli Variations, Beethoven*, and editor of *Beethoven's Compositional Process* and *The Second Practice of Nineteenth-Century Tonality*. He is currently working on an edition of Beethoven's sketchbook Artaria 195. As pianist, he often presents concerts and lecture recitals and has recorded Beethoven's last sonatas and Diabelli Variations.
- Birgit Lodes teaches at the University of Munich and is author of *Das Gloria in Beethovens Missa solemnis* (1997). She has recently published chapters on the Mass, the Requiem, and the Motet in the nineteenth century in the *Handbuch der musikalischen Gattungen*, vol. 9: *Messe und Motette* (1998). She is currently working on a book about music and musical life in Augsburg 1490–1530.
- Nicholas Marston is Reader in Music at the University of Oxford, and Fellow and Tutor of St. Peter's College. His research interests center on Beethoven sketch studies and Schenkerian analysis. In addition to *Beethoven's Piano Sonata in E, Op. 109* (1995) and *Schumann: Fantasie, Op. 17* (1992) he has published widely in leading academic journals. He currently serves on the editorial boards of *Beethoven Forum, Music Analysis*, and *The Journal of the Royal Musical Association.*
- Margaret Notley has published articles about Brahms, Schubert, Bruckner, and Viennese musical life in *19th-Century Music*, the *Journal of the American Musicological Society*, and a number of anthologies. She is currently writing a book about late Brahms.

The author of *Haydn* and the Classical Variation, Mozart: The "Jupiter" Symphony (Cambridge Music Handbook), and editor of *Haydn and His World*, she specializes in music and aesthetics of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, and has written on such topics as Beethoven and the meaning of *pathètique* and *fantasia*, Haydn's theater symphonies, the sublime in Mozart's music, and Brahms's variations. Preface and acknowledgments

The *Cambridge Companion to Beethoven* is principally about Beethoven's music and its reception. The music is placed in its historical contexts in chapters presenting a chronology and some thoughts about biography, a look at Beethoven's musical "thinking and doing" when not composing, and a discussion of the compositional process as revealed in sketches and autographs. These chapters are followed by a cross-genre examination of stylistic and structural questions, including a consideration of Beethoven's stylistic debts to (and independence from) the legacy of Haydn and Mozart – a discussion that also helps to establish historical context.

I asked the authors of the genre chapters to define for themselves problems specific to their genre as the basis for their thinking. They posed and solved the problems in various ways - with an emphasis on problems of ensemble (chamber music with piano, symphony), genre aesthetics (string quartet and *Lied*), the place of the genre within Beethoven's career and with respect to music in other genres (piano music, sacred music, and opera) - all of which further emphasize the importance of context to the understanding of Beethoven's achievement. Context also plays a role in the chapters on reception, a role that may be described as dialectical. The way that composers, performers, theorists, and participants in general culture have interpreted Beethoven's music has established the parameters for successive generations' views of his music and, it has been argued, all of music. At the same time, their approach has been influenced by currents in the musical life and in the broader cultural arena, as they developed during and after Beethoven's life. Our book takes its place within this process, reflecting traditional emphases in Beethoven studies and incorporating some of the most recent developments in musicology and theory that have served to broaden the perspectives of the field.

I owe thanks to many people. Alain Frogley and Peter Kaminsky, my colleagues at the University of Connecticut, helped me in the process of soliciting authors. I repeatedly turned to Alain Frogley and to Christopher Gibbs for advice in technical details. Barry Cooper, Alain Frogley, Christopher Hatch, Birgit Lodes, and Margaret Notley all made valuable comments on my chapter, while my assistant Sandra Binder helped me to prepare the chronology and the selected further reading. I would also like to thank the Research Foundation at the University of Connecticut for providing generous support for my work on this project. Finally a note of thanks to all the authors; this was a joint effort; it is our book, not mine.
