Authors receive fifty reprints of each article, with covers, and additional reprints may be purchased if desired.

Attention is called to the fact that the JOURNAL invites submission of (1) original technical papers in the field of symbolic logic, (2) expository papers in this field, (3) philosophical papers which bear upon this field or make use of its methods, and (4) studies in the history of logic in which modern technical developments are taken into account.
