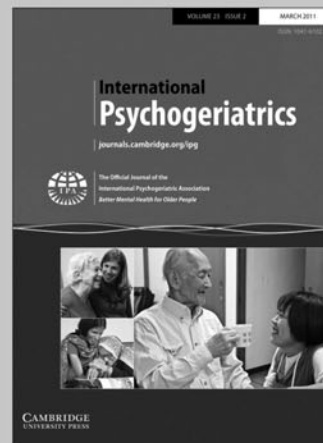

Priority is given to original research and systematic reviews about mental health service research, aimed to improve the quality of everyday practice.
