CHANGE OF EDITORSHIP. The present volume of *Language in Society* (vol. 29, 2000) marks a transition in the editorship of the journal; the newly appointed editor is Jane H. Hill.

Jane's doctorate in anthropology, at UCLA in 1966, was the first one I supervised. Looking back over the years, I now regard her, among all my former students, as the one who has had the most distinguished career. Most recently, she has had the honor of serving as President of the American Anthropological Association. It has been my pleasure to work with her on numerous projects, and I have always found her outstanding both as a scholar and a friend. I do not know any colleague who I would consider a better choice to edit *Language in Society*.

During the year 2000, Jane and I will in fact share editorial duties. Most of the manuscripts for volume 29 have already been accepted by me, and are in various stages of editorial processing; I will continue to work on these with the authors, through the stages of proofing and ultimate publication. In the meantime, Jane will assume responsibility for considering newly submitted manuscripts and for commissioning new book reviews. By the end of 2000, she will be in full charge of the editorship.
