1. Books on conducting

This is an alphabetical and largely comprehensive list of books about conducting technique, skills or training from 1800 to the present in the most common European languages. It also includes several important treatises on conducting (even if they are only pamphlets, letters or chapters in larger books).

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2. Books on conductors

Since books about conductors and their lives are quite common (and of varying quality), this is a greatly abbreviated list. (A complete list is forthcoming.) Books in English are given some priority as are books by conductors. While it is not always possible to distinguish between memoirs that ruminate on life and those that offer more practical advice on conducting, where that happens (as with Nicolai Malko or Bruno Walter for example) the technical manual is listed above and the biography is listed here. The list is limited to books, with the exception of several chapters, dissertations and articles on women conductors graciously provided by J. Michele Edwards.

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
