Editorship of the Bulletin: Pursuant to a decision taken at the First Annual Meeting at Northwestern University in September 1958, the Directors have proceeded to appoint an Editor for the African Studies Bulletin. Professor Margaret Bates of Goddard College has kindly consented to take on this task. The Association is particularly fortunate in securing Professor Bates' help, both because of her experience in Africa and because of professional work she has done of this nature in the past. She was formerly Editor of the quarterly, International Organization, published by the World Peace Foundation in Boston. Professor Bates has spent several years in England and Tanganyika, working on "Tanganyika under British Administration 1920-1955" in 1951-2 and 1954-7. She is presently Professor of History, at Goddard College, Plainfield, Vermont. Professor Bates will take over the active editorship of the Bulletin with the second issue of Volume II. The actual publication of the Bulletin will continue to be done through the New York office of the Association.
