# (g) LIBRARIAN AND LIBRARY COMMITTEE.

Dr. ALEXANDER WALK reported that the Library has settled down in its new quarters. The majority of the older books have now been classified. The gaps in the collection of modern works are well on the way to being filled and far fewer second-hand books of this kind are now being bought so that a greater proportion of our resources can be devoted to the purchase of new books and special works of historic interest.

Additions to the Library during the year numbered 110, and over 600 issues were made to members. One book list was issued during the year and another will be sent out in the autumn. Several gifts have been made to the Library during the year. In addition, Dr. Isabel Wilson has placed on permanent loan in the Library her collection of paintings, designed as table-mats, and forming two series entitled "The Famous Insane" and "Causes and Cures." It is hoped to have some of these on view at the next Quarterly Meeting.

The attempt to secure at an auction the late H. J. Norman's collection of psychiatric literature was unsuccessful.
