The annual institutional subscription rate is \$30.00, postage included. Single issues of the *Journal* and *Bibliography*, beginning with the May 1965 issue; cost \$8.00 plus postage for non-members and can be ordered from the Secretariat. Earlier issues may be purchased from A.M.S. Reprints, 56 E. 13th Street, New York, New York 10003.

Annual membership dues are \$25.00 for Regular members, \$12.50 for Retired members and \$12.50 for Student members (full-time students for 5 years only). Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the Style Sheet of the MLA (available from the Secretariat in Ann Arbor), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.
