Closure of Campbell Island facilities

New Zealand MetService announced the withdrawal of its five staff currently working there next spring. After more than 50 years subantarctic Campbell Island would again be deserted, with only an automatic weather station remaining.

Switzerland in the Antarctic

New Zealand and Switzerland recently signed an agreement on closer scientific links in Antarctica. Joint scientific projects in the Ross Sea region would now be possible, particularly those involving research on the impact of human activities on the Antarctic environment.

New Zealand review of Government science funding

A New Zealand review of Goverment science funing has recommended a shift away from traditional scientific research that bolsters the economy to social and environmental research. The government initiated draft report, *Establishing Priorities for the Public Good Science Fund*, says science projects that support the environment, society and 'infrastructure' should get greater priority during the next five years. Areas recommended for more research funding include environments, climate and atmosphehere and the Antarctic.

Fossil glyptodont from Seymour Island

The Cenozoic strata of Seymour Island continue to yield new palaeontological discoveries. Judd Case, of St Mary's College of California, and co-workers from the US Antarctic Program, have recovered fragments of a glyptodon, an extinct, giant armadillo-like mammal. The remains, from Eocene sands are reported to be those of a species unusually large for the time and to resemble others found in Patagonia.

Break-up of Larsen Ice Shelf

The recent break up of northern Larsen Ice Shelf, by disintegration and the calving of a giant iceberg, has been widely reported in the world press by Argentine and British scientists. The changes are depicted on *Handy Atlas* Map No. 12 on page 180.
