Nasal Mast Cells: A Preliminary Report on their Ultrastructure

The ultrastructural morphology of mast cells in the nose and the adenoids are compared. Normal cells have a very varied morphology with electron dense granules which have scrolls occasionally. Cells from patients with perennial allergic rhinitis show variable degranulation in all areas examined. Few cells were seen in the surface epithelium.
