H.C. Legal Consequences of the Construction of a Wall in the Occupied Palestinian Territory
The ICJ concluded that the specific construction of the wall in the occupied territories was not necessary to achieve its security objectives. It found that its construction constitutes a breach of international humanitarian law and human rights law.

Supreme Court of Israel: Beit Szevki Village Council v. the Government of Israel
The Supreme Court of Israel ruled that the construction of a wall in the area of the West Bank is illegal in order to avoid unnecessary hardship on the local Palestinian population. The Court found that the measures in Palestine were not proportional, and that they could be substituted by an alternative wall.

Special Court for Sierra Leone: Prosecutor v. Sam Hinga Norman
The Appeals Chamber of the Special Court for Sierra Leone held that the recruitment of child soldiers is a crime and a violation of international law.

United States Supreme Court: *Morley Rand v. Charles H. Bush*
The U.S. Supreme Court held that a U.S. District Court has jurisdiction to hear petitions challenging the type of detention of foreign nationals captured abroad in operations with armed conflict and involvement of a combatant's kin, Cuba.

Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals: *Osbaldo Torres v. the State of Oklahoma*
The Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals affirmed the conviction of the defendant for the murder of a police officer. The Court affirmed the conviction and remanded to the District Court for the purpose of ordering the defendant to pay the costs of the appeal.

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
