WORLD ORGANISATION OF SYSTEMS AND CYBERNETICS ELEVENTH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF CYBERNETICS AND SYSTEMS

CALL FOR PAPERS

The Eleventh International Congress of Cybernetics and Systems will be held at Brunel University, Uxbridge, Middlesex (West London), UK, from Monday August 23 till Friday August 27, 1999. This triennial event is supported by many international bodies concerned with computers, cybernetics, management, labour, systems and technology. The Honorary Congress Committee consists of eminent scientists and technologists of world repute.

The Eleventh Congress, dedicated to the memory of the late Professor Frank H. George, a Fellow of W.O.S.C. and first Professor of Cybernetics at Brunel University, a renowned cybernetician and outstanding scientist, will comprise opening and closing sessions, as well as symposia and section meetings.
