Lazerowitz, 31 Langworthy Road, Northampton, Massachusetts*. All manuscripts should be typewritten with wide margin and wide spacing between the lines, and the author should keep a complete copy; footnotes should be numbered consecutively and should also be typed with wide margin and wide spacing (preferably on a separate sheet). If an article is of more than thirty-two (printed) pages in length, the editors reserve the right to divide it between two or more, not necessarily consecutive, numbers. Authors receive fifty reprints of each article, with covers, and additional reprints may be purchased if desired.

Attention is called to the fact that the JOURNAL invites submission of (1) original technical papers in the field of symbolic logic, (2) expository papers in this field, (3) philosophical papers which bear upon this field or make use of its methods, and (4) studies in the history of logic in which modern technical developments are taken into account.

Authors and publishers are requested to send, for review, copies of books and reprints of articles in journals to *Alonzo Church, Fine Hall, Princeton University, Princeton, New Jersey*.
