- 80,000 RMB annual living stipend
- 20,000 RMB annual research stipend
- Insurance
- Host university tuition
- Roundtrip airfare
- In addition, the Research Ph.D. Fellowship provides financial support for a research visit to China by the grantee's home university adviser.
