Under the supervision of Clinic Director Professor Hannah Garry, students seek justice on behalf of victims, hold perpetrators of serious human rights abuses accountable and work toward progressive development of the law. Through this experience, students acquire knowledge and skills for effective international lawyering and human rights advocacy while supporting the critical work of human rights advocates and organizations worldwide.

The clinic has included casework and externships before the United Nations International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda, the Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia, the Special Tribunal for Lebanon and the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia. In addition, the clinic drafts amicus briefs in U.S. courts, providing an international human rights perspective to domestic legal issues such as juvenile life without parole sentencing. On March 22, 2011, New York Federal District Court Judge Denny Chin rejected a proposed settlement in two lawsuits against Google. The settlement would have allowed Google to continue scanning copyrighted books into its search index and displaying the text to its users in exchange for the payment of license fees to copyright holders.

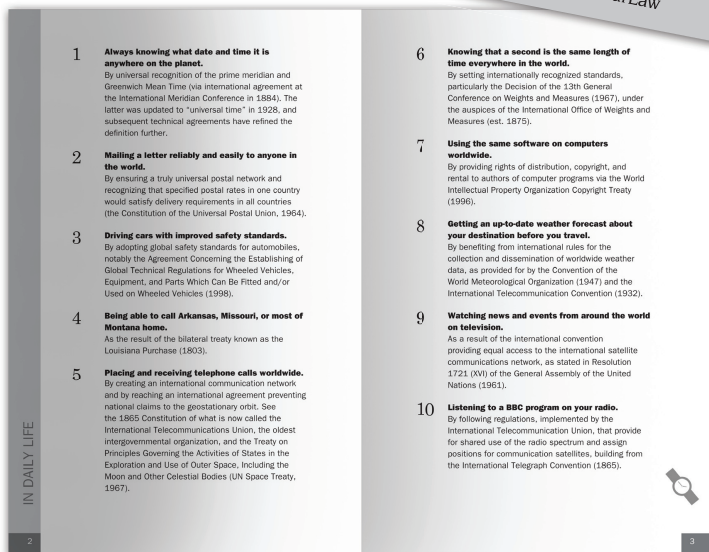

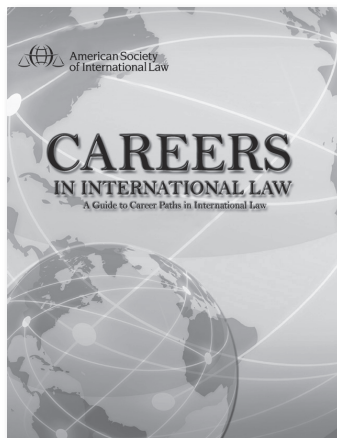
