Journal of Applied Gerontology is a forum for your ideas, papers, opinions, and announcements.

Both research reports and reviews of current research will be given equal consideration. The Journal provides a special feature in encouraging authors to submit brief reports of 1500 words or less that summarize current programs, services, and research activities.

All material should be submitted in quadruplicate. In general, manuscripts should not exceed twenty-five typed double-spaced pages including references, tables, and figures. Manuscripts should contain no identifying information. References must conform to the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, Third Edition. Attached to one copy should be a title page listing the author's name, affiliation, mailing address, telephone number, and, if desired, a stamped postcard to acknowledge receipt of the manuscript. All manuscripts are independently reviewed. All artwork appearing in the Journal must be professionally prepared and is the sole responsibility of the author. It is assumed that manuscripts are for exclusive consideration of the Journal and have not simultaneously been submitted elsewhere.
