Dr. R. J. RUSSELL read a paper on "Recent Developments in Intensified E.C.T." He told of the use of intensified E.C.T. for hysterics who are given their treatment in the first three or four days of the week and are discharged on the sixth day. The intensified E.C.T. was also given to severe schizophrenics until deep confusion was produced.

In the discussion which followed, Drs. H. PULLAR-STRECKER, J. M. CRAWFORD, O. FITZGERALD, C. KENTON, A. B. MONRO, W. J. MCCULLEY, W. J. T. KIMBER and others took part and Dr. R. J. RUSSELL replied.

Dr. FEDE M. SHATTOCK read a paper on "Vascular Changes in Schizophrenia," in which she showed that in schizophrenics the skin surface temperatures are lower than normal and that there is a retardation of the normal vasodilatation of the other limbs when one is warmed. She found a low blood pressure in catatonics with increase on remission.
