SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS

The *American Journal of International Law* (AJIL) invites submission of manuscripts on international law subjects. Its coverage extends beyond public international law to closely related issues of global governance, transnational law and national or sub-state law. It generally does not publish manuscripts focused on purely private or commercial law or on comparative or foreign law, including the internal law of the European Union.

The AJIL will not consider submissions whose content has been, or will be, published before it appears in this journal.

The AJIL does not require exclusive submissions. Priority consideration will, however, be accorded where the author states that the submission is exclusive for a specified period of at least six weeks and commits to accept an offer of publication within the specified time period. Authors should bear in mind that, as a professionally juried journal, the AJIL is rarely if ever able to make offers of publication in response to requests for expedited review within the time limits typically fixed by other journals that have made offers of publication.

Submissions should be in electronic form and should be transmitted as attachments to e-mail messages addressed to ajil@asil.org.

The AJIL currently uses Word 2010/2007, but can convert manuscripts created in other word processing programs (in such cases, please specify the program used—documents must be in easily edited formats). Please do not send manuscripts in PDF format.

Format and style guidelines: All manuscripts should be double-spaced in 12-point Times New Roman type; these formatting requirements cover all text, quotations, and footnotes.

The maximum length for lead articles is 30,000 words (including footnotes which should be complete and generally in conformity with *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation* (19th ed. 2010) as well as the AJIL Style Guide, available online at www.asil.org/ajil_style_guide.pdf).

Shorter pieces with less discursive footnotes are strongly encouraged and may receive more expedited review. The maximum length for “Current Developments” and “Notes and Comments” submissions is 11,000 words. All manuscripts should be accompanied by the author’s CV (in a separate document, and including a list of publications) as well as a short abstract of no more than 150 words.

Given the volume of submissions to the Journal, authors are strongly urged to strictly adhere to these guidelines; manuscripts that exceed the word limits indicated or whose footnotes are not in accord with the *The Bluebook* (see above) or not generally in conformity with the *Chicago Manual of Style* (16th ed. 2010) may be rejected for these reasons alone.

Book reviews are by invitation; however, you may suggest books for review to the AJIL Book Review Office, 2223 Massachusetts Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20008-2864, USA. **Books for review** should be sent to the same address.

The increasingly transnational nature of terrorist activities compels the international community to strengthen the legal framework in which counter-terrorist activities should occur, including at the intergovernmental level. This unique, timely, and carefully researched monograph examines one such important intergovernmental organisation, the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation ('OIC', formerly the Organisation of the Islamic Conference). In particular, it analyses in depth its institutional counter-terrorist law-making practice, and the relationship between resultant OIC law and comparable UN norms. Furthermore, it explores two common (mis)assumptions regarding the OIC, namely whether its internal institutional weaknesses mean that its law-making practice is inconsequential at the intergovernmental level, and whether its self-declared Islamic objectives and nature are reflected within OIC law.

This year marks a decade for the Judicial Skills Development Seminar, a unique three-way partnership between the University of Wisconsin Law School's East Asian Legal Studies Center, the Wisconsin Supreme Court, and the Shanghai High People's Court. INTERNATIONAL LAW: 100 WAYS IT SHAPES OUR LIVES

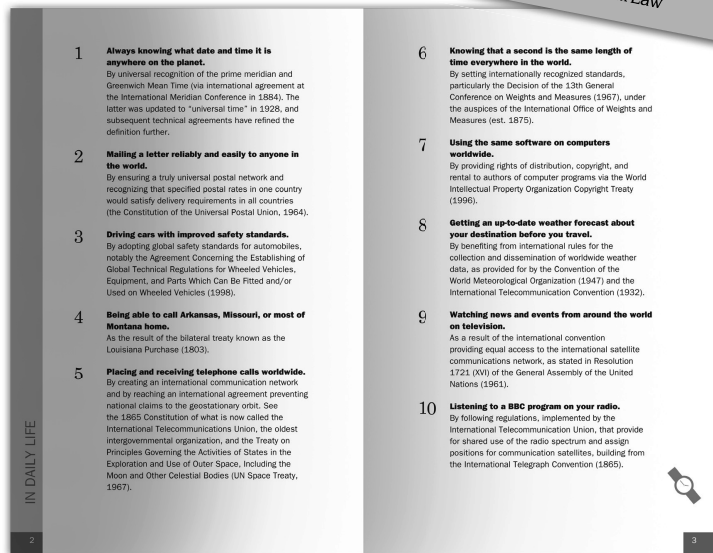
Many find international law abstract and static. Topics such as war and peace or relationships between countries are considered by some to be not so much questions of law, but of power and influence. Others question the existence of international law.

The ASIL Holtzmann Center is established in honor of Judge Howard M. Holtzmann. Over the course of his career, Judge Holtzmann has made enormous contributions to the field of international arbitration and conciliation, and mentored scores of young lawyers working in the field. He was central to the American Arbitration Association (AAA) work with the Arbitration Institute of the Stockholm Chamber of Commerce to build an East-West bridge through international arbitration. Notable achievements include: service as a member of the U.S. delegation to the Arbitration Working Group of the UN Commission on International Trade Law (1974-2011), which produced the UNCITRAL Arbitration Rules, the UNCITRAL Conciliation Rules, and the UNCITRAL Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration, and service as a Member of the Iran-U.S. Claims Tribunal (1981-1994). For his pioneering work, the King of Sweden inducted Judge Holtzmann as a Commander of the Royal Order of the Polar Star in 2003. In 2005, he received the Silver Medal of Honor of Vienna, and in 2006, the AAA gave him its highest honor, the Peacemaker Award, for his "work to further peace throughout the world." Judge Holtzmann has been a member of ASIL since 1972.
