

Replacement name for *Eupithecia deserticola* (Lepidoptera: Geometridae: Eupitheciini)

Abstract—The name *Eupithecia deserticola* McDunnough, 1946 is a junior secondary homonym of *Tephroclystia deserticola* Turati, 1934, now included in the genus *Eupithecia* Curtis. The replacement name *Eupithecia jamesi* Ferris and Mironov is proposed.

Résumé—Le nom *Eupithecia deserticola* McDunnough, 1946 est un homonyme secondaire plus récent de *Tephroclystia deserticola* Turati, 1934, inclus maintenant dans le genre *Eupithecia* Curtis. Le nouveau nom de substitution *Eupithecia jamesi* Ferris and Mironov est proposé.

Several homonyms occur in Scoble's (1999) list of *Eupithecia* species. According to Article 60 of the fourth edition of the *International Code of Zoological Nomenclature* (International Commission on Zoological Nomenclature 1999), many of these junior primary and secondary homonyms require replacement names. In this article we propose a new name to replace the species name *Eupithecia deserticola* McDunnough, 1946.

The species *Tephroclystia deserticola* was described by Turati (1934) based on a single specimen from North Africa (Libya). A second species, also based on a single specimen, with the name *Eupithecia deserticola* was subsequently described by McDunnough (1946) from California, United States. The male holotype is in the Canadian National Collection, Ottawa, Ontario, Canada. The type locality is Borego Valley, S[an] Diego Co., Calif[ornia], [United States].

The genus name *Tephroclystia* Hübner, (1825) is a junior synonym of *Eupithecia* Curtis, 1825. The species *deserticola* was treated by Prout (1915) as a greyish form of *Eupithecia tenellata* Dietze, 1906. Scoble (1999) initially proposed the synonymy between *Eupithecia tenellata* and *Tephroclystia deserticola*. Subsequently the holotype of

Eupithecia (=*Tephroclystia*) *deserticola* Turati was examined and photographed by V.G. Mironov to confirm Scoble's action. Both authors have examined photographs of the holotype of *Eupithecia deserticola* McDunnough. The species name *deserticola* Turati is an available name according to the Code.



Since the name *Eupithecia deserticola* McDunnough is a junior secondary homonym of *Tephroclystia deserticola* Turati, under the Code a replacement name is required. To replace the name *Eupithecia deserticola* McDunnough, we propose the name *Eupithecia jamesi* Ferris and Mironov to honor Dr. James Halliday McDunnough (1877–1962), linguist, musician, entomological taxonomist, and builder of insect collections. The name *Eupithecia macdunnoughi* Rindge, 1952 is preoccupied.
