THE JOHN DUNNE MEDAL was established to symbolise excellence and originality in the field of psychiatric research. Awarded annually, this prestigious prize is open to all trainees from Ireland, Northern Ireland and Britain. To be eligible, a trainee must have made a significant contribution (though not necessarily as first author) to an original paper published by the Journal over the year.

The winner is judged by an international panel. The John Dunne Medal was sculpted in bronze by Robin Buick, ARHA, and has been exhibited by the Royal Hibernian Academy.
