#### New books

Peter Scott - painter and naturalist. E Huxley. 1993. Faber. ISBN 0 571 16146 4. £17.50. Children always have problems following a famous father. This biographer has followed an excellent biography of Robert Falcon Scott with an equally readable account of his son. With an ambitious mother and remarkable connections in high places Peter Scott had a wealth of opportunities but deliberately avoided competing with his father. This very well-written book shows how he realized his own capabilities and dreams, providing leadership in world conservation and personal achievement in several sports, before taking up Antarctic conservation in his last few years. A fascinating life, but even the biographer doubts that he could really have been as perfect as many of the recollections suggest!

A complete Taxonomic and Geographic Index to the book Antarctic Microbiology, edited by E.I. Friedmann, has been prepared by Dr Ann B. Thistle. The index lists over 1500 items with several thousands of references to the text. ### Terra Antartica

The Italian earth sciences community working in Antarctica is involved in a wide range of national and international programmes. However, since participants are from many different universities, research councils and institutes there is at present no easy way to bring these activities to a focus and provide all the scientists involved with current information on related activities. Carlo A. Ricci intends to provide such a focus with a newsletter - Terra Antartica - published under the auspices of Italian SCAR. It will contain short papers, letters, field data reports, and occasional review articles on all aspects of earth sciences (including geophysics and glaciology). In addition it will provide news from international programmes, and abstracts of papers for forthcoming meetings. The newsletter will be in English and the first issue will appear in Spring 1994. ### **FROST**

SCAR's Physics and Chemistry of the Atmosphere group are planning the First Regional Observing Study of the Troposphere (FROST) to assess international capabilities for numerical analyses and meteorological forcasting for the continent. The project is based around three special observing periods (SOPs) scheduled for July 1994, 16 October–15 November 1994 and January 1995. All countries involved in meteorological observing can contribute and have already been sent details of the project. ## Antarctic Digital Database published on CD-ROM

The publication of this topographic database, by SCAR, represents a major development in Antarctic mapping. The CD carries the first seamless digital map of Antarctica (for land areas south of 60°S), based on source material ranging from 1:200 000 to 1:5 000 000. It can be used to generate customized maps for scientific, operational and educational purposes and to provide the topographic framework for a variety of GIS appications.
