Comparative Politics

The Gregory Luebbert Book Award, for the best book in the field of comparative politics in the previous year, was presented to **Nicolas van de Walle**, Michigan State University, *African Economies and the Politics of Permanent Crisis, 1979-1999* (Cambridge University Press, 2001). Runner up was **Evelyn Huber** and **John Stephens**, for *Development and Crisis of the Welfare State: Parties and Politics in Global Markets* (University of Chicago Press, 2001).

The Gregory Luebbert Article Award, for the best article in the field of comparative politics in the previous year, was given to **Guillermo A. O'Donnell**, University of Notre Dame, for "Democracy, Law, and Comparative Politics," *Studies in Comparative International Development*, Vol. 36 (Spring 2001). Runners up were **Michael L. Ross**, UCLA, "Does Oil Hinder Democracy?" *World Politics* Vol. 53 (April 2001), and **Ashutosh Varshney**, University of Michigan, "Ethnic Conflict and Civil Society: India and Beyond," *World Politics* Vol. 53 (April 2001). The Sage Paper Award, for the best paper in the field of comparative politics presented at the previous APSA meeting, was awarded to **James Gibson**, Washington University, for "Does Truth Lead to Reconciliation? Testing the Causal Assumptions of the South African Truth and Recon-
