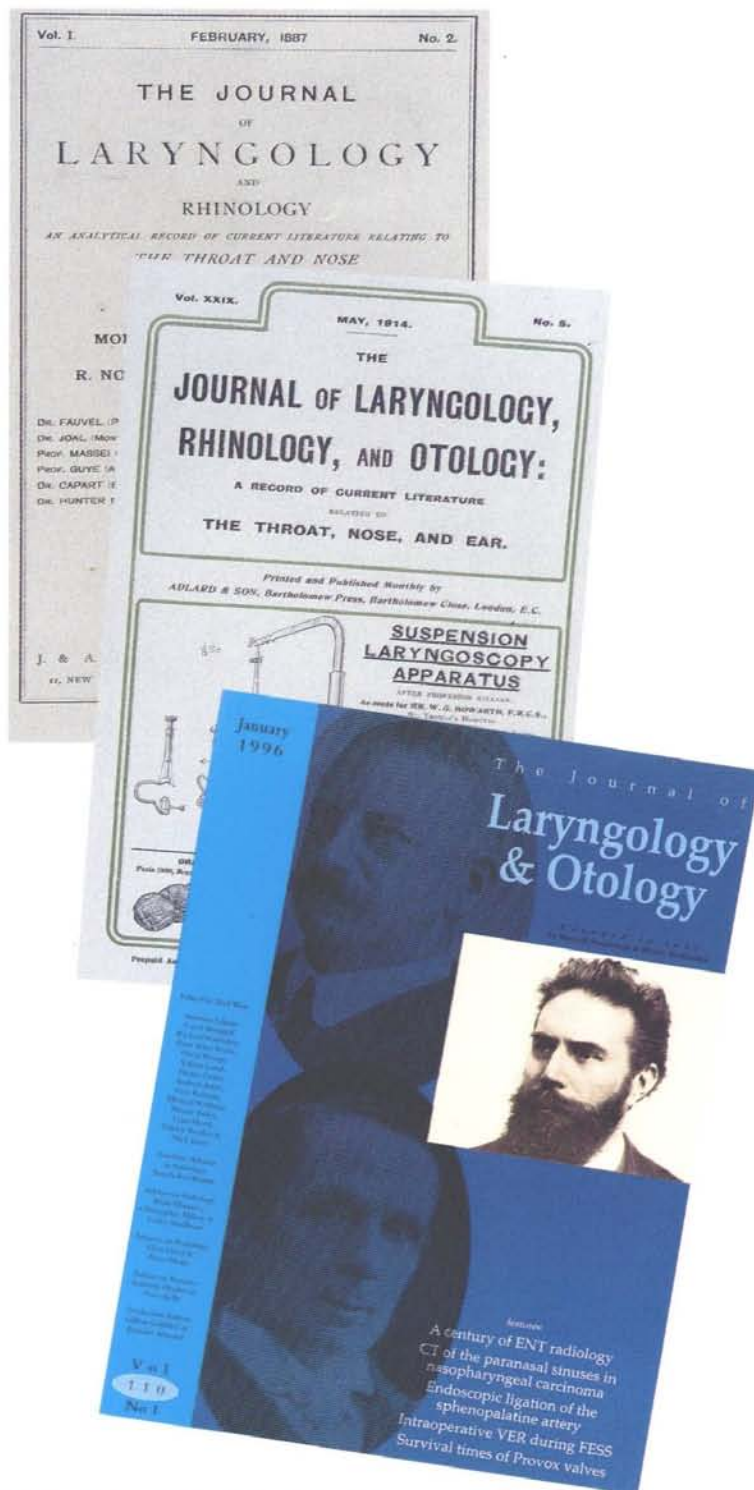


PUBLISHED EVERY MONTH SINCE 1887
