News

Antarctic pilot killed

Giles Kershaw, Antarctic pilot with British Antarctic Survey, Adventure Network and Trans-Globe Expedition, killed in an aircraft accident on 5 March on the Antarctic Peninsula.

Full station for Ecuador

Ecuador already has the Refugio Republica del Ecuador at 62°07'15.7"S, 58°23'42"W in Admiralty Bay. It is intended to establish a full station this year on Ash Point, Greenwich Island (62°27"S, 59°41'36"W. The station will be called Pedro Vicente Maldonado.

New station for Czechoslovakia

Czechoslovakia is to build a station on Rip Point, Nelson Island (62°15'S. 58°59'W) this year.

Joint expedition to Antarctica

Pakistan has announced that it will take part in a joint Antarctic expedition with the Soviet Union.

Convention on the Regulation of Antarctic Mineral Resource Activities

New Zealand has announced that, to break the current deadlock, it will not continue to press for immediate ratification of CRAMRA. Prime Minister Palmer has stressed that agreement on waste disposal and pollution is a more pressing necessity. He has suggested that the present voluntary moratorium on mining could be made legally binding and long-term.

New tourist ships

Two new ice-strengthened Antarctic cruise ships have been ordered from Rauma of Finland by Discoverer Reederei GmbH who own *World Discoverer* and *Society Explorer*. The first ship will be delivered in 1991. Each will carry 188 passengers and a crew of 130. The ships will be capable of 60 day cruises with a 15,000 km range.

Indian deaths

On 8 January 3 scientists and a naval technician died from carbon monoxide poisoning in a field camp in the Humboldt Mountain area.

Changes in the South African National Antarctic Research Programme.

From 1 August 1989, the administration of South Africa's Antarctic and Subantarctic Research Programme (SANARP) passed from the Foundation for Research Development of the CSIR to the Department of Environment Affairs. A new committee, the South African Committee for Antarctic Research (SACAR), now operates to give scientific advice to the department. Active scientists in the fields of biology, oceanography, and earth and physical sciences are members of SACAR. The South African National Committee for SCAR, however, will still be administered by the FRD, the South African body adhering to ICSU, in line with the non-governmental nature of SCAR. A suite of new research projects is planned to commence from 1991, with the emphasis swinging away from the subantarctic islands to the Antarctic continent. However, research at Marion Island, especially in the life sciences, is likely to continue. Internationally, perhaps the most important change is that Dr Pat Condy is no longer involved with SANARP.

NISC Arctic and Antarctic regions database on CD-ROM

The National Information Services Corporation (NISC) has published its second earth sciences database on compact disc. The database contains over 147,000 citations compiled over 40 years by the Science and Technology Division of the US Library of Congress. The database includes abstracts of articles from thousands of different journals covering many disciplines and offers users the facility to search 40 years of Antarctic bibliography in seconds.
