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shi 石 = picul = 120 jin, or 72 kg
jin 斤 = pound = 600 grams
tun 屯 = hank of silk floss or thread ( = 6 liang)
liang 两 = ounce = 1/16th of a pound = 37.5 grams
qian 錢 = 1/10th of an ounce = 0.38 gram
zhu 銖 = 1/24th of an ounce = 1.6 grams
lei 累 = 1/24oth of an ounce
(1 liang = 4 fen = 24 zhu = 240 lei)

Volume

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shi 石 = picul = 10 pecks = 60 litres dou 斗 = peck = 6 litres sheng 升 = pint = 0.6 litre he 合 = 1/10th of a pint = 0.06 litre
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Coins

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guan 貫 = string of 1,000 coins (qian) – this was the standard but many strings contained far fewer, often between 700 and 800 qian 錢 1 coin (also known in English as 'cash coin')
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
