Apology

In issue no. 150 (November 2012), pp 325–31, *I.H.S.* carried a review article entitled ‘Revolutionary violence and Irish historiography’, discussing a volume of essays entitled *Terror in Ireland 1916–1923*, edited by David Fitzpatrick (Dublin, 2012). One of the essays, by Dr Eve Morrison, entitled ‘Kilmichael revisited: Tom Barry and the “false surrender”’, concerns a much-debated military engagement that took place in November 1920 at Kilmichael. In the course of the review, the reviewer states that ‘the author provides little evidence for her assertion that Barry invented the false surrender story and then convinced his colleagues to maintain a fifty-year conspiracy of silence about it’ (p. 327).

The editors have examined Dr Morrison’s essay and found no evidence of any such assertion on her part. Accordingly, they wish to apologise to her for this error.
