

## CORRESPONDENCE

In *C.R.* lxxx (1966), 323, Professor F. R. D. Goodyear writes as follows concerning my chapter on 'The Language of Lucretius' in *Lucretius*, edited by D. R. Dudley (1965): 'he seems to imply that, if we accept that there was an evolution of Latin hexameter poetry from Ennius to Lucretius to Virgil, this entails that Lucretius must be judged by Virgilian standards'. My basic theme, enunciated on p. 71 and argued at some length, was (naturally) that Lucretius must *not* be judged by such

standards. I regret that some alleged lack of clarity on my part may have led the reviewer to such a preposterous conclusion; but my argument was apparently clear to Mr. David A. West, who wrote in *J.R.S.* lvi (1966), 275, 'W. S. Maguinness . . . delivers an attack upon the tendency to condemn Republican poets for failing to comply with Augustan standards.'
