Sir John Gilbert was a prolific British artist of the mid-to-late nineteenth century; the Folger holds many of his drawings and engravings that illustrate Shakespeare's works, including several vibrant ones of the sonnets. Here Gilbert illustrates those that glory "in their hawks and hounds" (4), unlike the speaker, who finds his lover "of more delight than hawks or horses be" (11).
